

Derm notes is a concise reference that quickly defines each condition, gives etiology and prevalence within patient populations, and presents treatment options. It also contains images that are excellent for recognizing conditions as they present in the clinic. I am currently on my Pediatrics rotation and have referred to Derm Notes frequently to confirm diagnoses and consult treatment plans. It can't replace a large dermatology atlas, but that isn't its function. This book does what it's designed to do, provide a fast and accurate clinical reference for students and providers. This book can take a lot of abuse. The plastic pages are tear-proof and can be written on and wiped off. Mine has seen heavy use without a mark or rip to show for it. This book is money well-spent.

Drs. Barankin and Freiman's book is an invaluable educational tool for trainees and general physicians to have when confronted with patients who have skin disorders. It provides the basics and also information on 99% of the cutaneous disorders one will encounter in the clinic and on the wards. They competently review a host of disorders and treatment options, letting the reader know what is most likely and how to approach it. No trainee should be without this book. The authors are

at the forefront of dermatologic education and one anticipates more useful tomes from them in future.

This is a valuable little tool to have at your disposal- especially during a derm rotation. Very concise and logically arranged. The print quality is excellent and there is a laminated feel to the pages. The ringed binder at the top is well built so don't worry about the pages coming out. Yes, there are some imperfections as others have noted; however, I am under the belief that the pros largely outweigh the cons. My one complaint is that it's a little bulky and makes the pocket of my white coat stick out too much. I don't think that's a good look for clinic. Just a personal opinion. A solution to this would be to take it off the binder and remove some of the sections that you've already committed to memory to reduce the overall bulk.

Fits right into your lab coat, and has absolutely everything you would need to as a student or beginner in a dermatology setting. Also very helpful for primary care settings with higher populations of geriatric patients, as they often present with skin conditions that are well described in this pocket reference. Great find for a wonderful price!

I was looking for a little guide to help me identify skin conditions quickly, at the bedside. Derm Notes is a nifty little book, that has alphabetized tabs and skin conditions for quick reference. My only complaint about this guide, and one that won't apply to most potential purchasers, is that as a pediatric provider, there are a few key conditions specific to pediatrics missing from this book. I would love to see a pediatrics dermatology notes, but since there is none, this book is the next best thing. Highly recommended.

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
